Draft Minutes of the Mineral Springs Town Council Regular Meeting September 9, 2021 – 7:30 p.m.

The Town Council of the Town of Mineral Springs, North Carolina, met in Regular Session at the Mineral Springs Town Hall located at 3506 Potter Road South, Mineral Springs, North Carolina, at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, September 9, 2021.

Present: Mayor Frederick Becker III, Mayor Pro Tem Valerie Coffey, Councilman Jerry

Countryman, Councilwoman Lundeen Cureton, and Councilwoman Bettylyn Krafft.

Absent: Councilwoman Janet Critz and Attorney Bobby Griffin.

Staff Present: Town Clerk/Zoning Administrator Vicky Brooks and Deputy Town Clerk Janet Ridings.

Visitors: None.

1. Opening

With a quorum present at 7:30 p.m. on September 9, 2021, Mayor Frederick Becker called the Regular Town Council Meeting to order.

Councilwoman Cureton delivered the invocation.

Pledge of Allegiance.

2. Public Comments

There were no public comments.

3. Consent Agenda – Action Item

Councilwoman Coffey motioned to approve the consent agenda containing the August 12, 2021 Evidentiary Hearing / Regular Meeting Minutes and the July 2021 Finance Report and Councilman Countryman seconded. The motion passed unanimously. Ayes: Coffey, Countryman, Cureton, and Krafft. Nays: None.

4. 2021 Property Tax Order of Collection – Action Item

Mayor Becker explained the county was a little behind, but the settlement was received, and it seems to have balanced for last year and previous years. The council can approve the settlement, but Vann Harrell and Robin Merry have not drafted the Order of Collection yet, so that will be on the agenda for next month.

The tax bills have been sent out; however, there was a miscommunication between Mayor Becker and the tax office in June or July and they did not get the proper tax rate for Mineral Springs. The tax bill shows the Mineral Springs portion as being 2.5 cents. Mayor Becker contacted Vann Harrell and he got to work on it; they are rebilling all the town residents and taxpayers. Anyone who has paid already will get a refund from the county. It is a small amount, 4/10ths of a cent (\$4 per \$100,000 of valuation), but it has to be right.

Councilman Countryman asked what the actual rate was.

Mayor Becker responded it was 2.1 cents, which is what the council adopted in the budget.

Mayor Becker noted the Order of Collection would probably reflect the proper amount and he should have it for the council next month.

Councilwoman Coffey motioned to approve the settlement and Councilwoman Krafft seconded. The motion passed unanimously. Ayes: Coffey, Countryman, Cureton, and Krafft. Nays: None.

5. Prior Years' Tax Settlement and Write-Offs – Action Item

Mayor Becker explained this was the last settlement for the legacy taxes that Janet Ridings was tasked with collecting way back when she started in the tax collector job. The last two payments of \$28.64 were all that was left for the previous years and those must roll off based on statute because they are 10 years old. The property taxes balance out to zero.

Councilman Countryman motioned to approve the settlement and Councilwoman Cureton seconded. The motion passed unanimously. Ayes: Coffey, Countryman, Cureton, and Krafft. Nays: None.

6. NCDOT Updates

Mayor Becker explained this is information and there was no action required yet. Mayor Becker commented he thought he was disappointed, but he "kind of" trusts the NCDOT. Mayor Becker referred to his memo and explained NCDOT ran simulations from every combination of green arrows and did not find a significant improvement and in some cases, they found a worsening of congestion (from an aggregate throughout the day). Mayor Becker stated he did not talk to Tony [Tagliaferri from NCDOT], he just read his emails, but he thought part of it was that they could not put a light in that was smart enough to know whether a car was going to turn left or go straight, so they cannot have it as smart as they would like it to be because it is only one lane. Setting the light to give 15 seconds for left turns with no left turners will cause a backup for all those straight people for 15 seconds. There is not enough benefit from the extra time for the turners to make it work. NCDOT even tried a four-way stop in the computer model and that was horrible. Mayor Becker explained that short-term temporary fix for maybe \$10,000 seemed like a good idea at the time and he was glad NCDOT was willing to give it a shot, but he was also glad NCDOT was not going to tell the town to pay them the money and they do it and then have it not work out. Mayor Becker stated NCDOT "did right by us."

The second design is to change Potter and Pleasant Grove to a three-way stop and change the angle of approach where Pleasant Grove comes into Potter. That is a more expensive project, which would not be on the town, if NCDOT can get it funded through spot safety, then they will go ahead and do it. NCDOT does think it would improve the situation at that intersection, because that is a high wreck intersection regarded by people that live near it who are hearing the crashing all the time. This is an \$88,000 job according to NCDOT, but it would be a NCDOT funded project if it takes place.

7. Proclamation for Constitution Week – Action Item

Mayor Becker explained this proclamation was sent to the town by Elizabeth Gibson to declare September 17th through the 23rd as Constitution Week. The town has adopted this one quite a few years running now, and it is very important.

Councilman Countryman motioned to adopt the proclamation for Constitution Week and Councilwoman Krafft seconded. The motion passed unanimously. Ayes: Coffey, Countryman, Cureton, and Krafft. Nays: None.

The proclamation is as follows:

Town of Mineral Springs Proclamation

Constitution Week September 17th – 23rd, 2021

Whereas, the Constitution of the United States of America, the guardian of our liberties, embodies the principles of limited government in a Republic dedicated to rule by law; and

Whereas, September 17, 2021, marks the two hundred thirty-fourth anniversary of the framing of the Constitution of the United States of America by the Constitutional Convention; and

Whereas, it is fitting and proper to accord official recognition to this magnificent document and its memorable anniversary, and to the patriotic celebrations which will commemorate it; and

Whereas, Public Law 915 guarantees the issuing of a proclamation each year by the President of the United States of America designating September 17 through 23 as Constitution Week.

Now, Therefore, I, Frederick Becker, III, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the Town of Mineral Springs in the State of North Carolina do hereby proclaim the week of September 17 through 23, 2021 as

and ask our citizens to reaffirm the ideals the Framers of the Constitution had in 1787 by vigilantly protecting the freedoms guaranteed to us through this guardian of our liberties.

8. Proclamation for Domestic Violence Month – Action Item

Mayor Becker explained this proclamation was to proclaim October as Domestic Violence Protection Month and it is sponsored by Turning Point.

Councilwoman Coffey motioned that we adopt the proclamation in observance of Domestic Violence Month and Councilman Countryman seconded. The motioned passed unanimously. Ayes: Coffey, Countryman, Cureton, and Krafft. Nays: None.

The proclamation is as follows:

TOWN OF MINERAL SPRINGS PROCLAMATION DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS, domestic violence affects all Union County residents, and far too many people suffer abuse at the hands of a spouse, partner, parent, child, or sibling; these victims can be of any age, race, religion, or economic status and the resulting damage is inflicted not only on the victims, but their children, families, and communities; and

WHEREAS, domestic violence includes not only physical but also mental abuse, emotional abuse, financial abuse, sexual abuse, and isolation; and

WHEREAS, domestic violence is widespread, including one in four families is impacted by domestic violence with an annual cost to Union County of \$11,688,756; and

WHEREAS, according to the North Carolina Coalition Against Domestic Violence, there have been 1,421 women, men, and children murdered as a result of domestic violence since January 1, 2002 in North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, according to the North Carolina Council for Women, domestic violence programs across the state responded to over 48,310 crisis calls and provided services to over 34,245 victims last year; and

WHEREAS, the key to prevention is education, community awareness, having zero tolerance for domestic vioence, and requiring accountability by the abuser; and

WHEREAS, Union County recognizes the importance of having collaborations by multiple partners to promote social norms, policies and laws that support gender equity and foster intimate partnerships based on mutual respect, equality, and trust; and

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that I, Frederick Becker III, Mayor of the Town of Mineral Springs, do hereby proclaim October 2021 as Domestic Violence Awareness Month in Union County and urge all citizens to support this observance. I further urge our citizens to increase their awareness and education of this destructive force which deeply affects a large number of families in our State each year and to become part of the efforts to stop violence in families.

9. Consideration of Adopting O-2021-03 - Concurring Speed Limit - Action Item

Mayor Becker explained there was a revised version of the ordinance in front of the council, because there was a little weirdness in the way the material came from NCDOT. The ordinance in the agenda packet ended up being a little confusing, so Ms. Brooks and Mayor Becker looked it over and Ms. Brooks clarified it to make it one simple 45 miles an hour on state route 1008 between those two end points from Knotty Pine to just north of McNeely.

Councilman Countryman motioned to approve the ordinance declaring a speed change as indicated and Councilwoman Cureton. The motion passed unanimously. Ayes: Coffey, Countryman, Cureton, and Krafft. Nays: None.

Re: Agenda Item 6 - Consideration of Initiating Collection of Zoning Violation Penalties

In April of 2021, the town received a zoning complaint about multiple cars, trailers, boats being stored at 6620 McNeely Road. After an investigation was conducted, the property owner (according to Union County property tax records) was initially notified of the zoning violation. The notice cited Section 5.5.9 (c) of the Mineral Springs Development Ordinance, which states: "on any residentially zoning or used lot, commercial vehicles shall be parked in the side or rear yard only." Addition, Section 4.4.2.2 (b) states: "storage outside of a substantially enclosed structure of any motor vehicle that is neither licensed nor operational shall not be regarded as accessory to a principal use and is prohibited in all zoning districts, unless otherwise specified in this Ordinance."

The original initial notification of zoning violation went out to Tammy and Melvin Johnson, as well as to the "Occupant" of the property. Mrs. Johnson contacted the town to inform us that they no longer owned the property, and the new owner was Shannon and Phillip Donato. In May of 2021, a notice of zoning violation was sent out to the new owners. Mrs. Donato did reach out to the town on May 25, 2021 and explained they were in the process of buying a new home, they would try to move what they could but some of it they had nowhere else to put it until they moved. Mrs. Donato noted there had not been a problem until that point in time and they had been at that location for over 2 years. Mrs. Donato asked for the town to allow them some more time to get it figured out. In July, after not hearing anything else from Mrs. Donato or seeing any progress on correcting the zoning violation in any way, I sent out a notice of zoning violation informing Mr. & Mrs. Donato that a civil citation of \$50 each calendar day would begin on August 2, 2021 if the violation still existed.

The first civil citation was issued on August 2, 2021 and have been occurring each calendar day since then. No payments have been received to date nor has any action been taken to remedy the zoning violation. As of October 7, 2021, the Donato's have accumulated 69 calendar days of violation, which amounts to \$3,450.00.

As I told Mrs. Donato when she emailed to ask if something could be worked out, because they could not pay the civil citations, it is out of my hands once the penalties begin, it is up to the town council to make that decision. At this point, the town council will need to decide if they wish to get Attorney Griffin involved to begin the collection process or if you wish to give leniency to the property owner.

Included below is Section 2.7.3 Remedies & Penalties from the Mineral Springs Development Ordinance and a few pictures of the property in violation:

2.7.3 Remedies & Penalties

- A. Subject to NCGS 160A-175, 160D-106, 160D-404, and NCGS 14-4, any person, firm or corporation violating any provision of this Ordinance shall be subject to a civil penalty of fifty dollars (\$50.00) per day for each calendar day that the violation exists. Violations of this Ordinance shall not constitute a misdemeanor or infraction. Proceeds from civil penalties collected under this Ordinance shall go into the Town's general fund.
- B. The Town may file a civil action to recover said penalty, if the offender does not pay said penalty within five (5) days after the offender has been cited for violation of the Ordinance.
- C. The Town may also seek any appropriate equitable relief issuing from a court of competent jurisdiction that it deems necessary to ensure compliance with the provisions of this Ordinance. In such case, the General Court of Justice shall have jurisdiction to issue such orders as may be appropriate, and it shall not be a defense to the application of the Town for equitable relief that there is an adequate remedy at law.
- D. If a building or structure is erected, constructed, reconstructed, altered, repaired, converted, or maintained, or any building, structure or land is used in violation of this Ordinance or other regulation made under authority conferred thereby, the Town in addition to other remedies, may institute any appropriate action or proceedings to prevent the unlawful erection, construction, reconstruction, alteration, repair, conversion, maintenance or use, to restrain, correct or abate the violation, to prevent occupancy of the building, structure or land or to prevent any illegal act, conduct, business or use in or about the premises. Such action may include the issuance of a stop-work order, subject to NCGS 160D-404 (b).
- E. The Town may seek a mandatory or prohibitory injunction and an order of abatement commanding the offender to correct the unlawful condition upon or cease the unlawful use of the subject premises. The action shall be governed in all respects by the laws and rules governing civil proceedings, including the Rules of Civil Procedure in general and Rule 65 in particular.
- F. For development or use of a property inconsistent with the development approval, the Town may revoke the development approval in the same manner in which the approval was given, subject to NCGS 160D-403 (f).
- G. The above remedies are cumulative, and the Town may pursue any or all of the same as its direction. Each calendar day that the violation exists shall constitute a separate offense.
